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Senior Year Scheduling	Process will take place throughout February-starting with Feb. 8th when students are given scheduling materials/instructions to get started. MME (Michigan Merit Exam) Testing – 2 days SAT/WORKKEYS/M-STEP Participation is a graduation requirement!	Students meet with counselors to prepare paper-work for MME April test <u>April 13:</u> SAT (student will receive an official SAT score that can be used for college application) <u>April 14:</u> WorkKeys® Tests Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. <u>April 15:</u> M-STEP Note: test takes place right after spring break	Free test taken during the school day (mornings). Bring no. 2 pencils, calculator and ID each day of testing. Get a good night's rest and eat breakfast. ©
ACT National Testing (dates-not at RHS)	Test dates: Dec. 12, 2020 Feb 6, 2021 April 17, 2021 June 12, 2021 July 17, 2021	Register online at <u>www.actstudent.org</u> if you would like to take the ACT. Registration deadlines apply.
SAT National Testing (dates-not at RHS)	Test dates: Dec 5, 2020 Mar 13, 2021 May 8, 2021 June 5, 2021	Register online at <u>www.collegeboard.org</u> to take additional SAT tests. Registration deadlines apply.
<i>Research summer plans:</i> Enrichment Programs, Classes, Volunteer and Jobs	Throughout semester 2	Get a head start on summer plans and get them locked in. Save summer earnings for college!
College Campus Visits	Winter and spring break, summer and even fall of senior yearwhenever you can squeeze it in—but be sure to do it!	Contact school to make an appointment and/or reserve a spot on a tour before heading out to the campus. Usually can sign up online on college webpage.
NCAA clearinghouse (college athletes)	Before junior year ends, please complete registration if you plan to play division 1 or 2 sports in college. NOTIFY YOUR COUNSELOR!	College student athletes must register at NCAA Clearinghouse Eligibility Center <u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u> . Students must also register with <u>www.Parchment.com</u> to send official transcripts to the NCAA at the end of their junior year and also send test scores.
Letters of Recommendation	May – June 2021	Create a plan for receiving a letter of rec. Ask your teacher before leaving for the summer if they are willing to write you a letter in the fall. Usually needs to be an academic teacher.
-Create a Resume -Start drafting college app essays (if your college require them)	June – August 2021	Use the Xello button on the counseling webpage to access the resume builder or create your own document to show colleges what you have done beyond course work. This will also be used to give to teachers that are writing letters of recommendation for you!

SENIOR YEAR

Begin to fill out college applications	Summer/Fall, 2021	Students can get a head start filling out college applications on-line during the summer and making sure ACT/SAT scores are sent to colleges via the testing website.
Attend Senior meeting	First Friday after school starts in senior year	Seniors will meet with their counselor during school to review the college application process and learn how to send transcripts to colleges—transcripts will not be sent from RHS until after this meeting.
SAT/ACT national retake dates	Sept. & Oct. 2021	Seniors may want to re-take for admissions or scholarship purposes. Check testing websites.
